Review and appeals s150/s150A



This fact sheet provides an overview for practitioners' review and appeals rights for decisions made by the Council using their powers under s150 of the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (NSW)*.

You should seek advice about your individual circumstances. Your insurer, trade union or an independent lawyer may be able to assist. Council staff can provide information about the process of seeking a review or appeal.

Review

What

You can seek a review if you believe the conditions or suspension imposed on your registration are no longer appropriate.

We will consider how your circumstances have changed since we made the decision.

When

You can seek a review at any time.

Who

The review is handled by us.

How

You can write to our Executive Officer to request a review. To support your request, you should address include material that shows how your circumstances have changed since the conditions or suspension were imposed.

What next

If we consider your application to be frivolous or vexatious we will not proceed with the review.

We will tell you if we are able to consider your application for review, and if so,

- when and how we will consider your review and how you may participate, and
- when you can expect to receive the outcome.

Appeal

What

An appeal is a formal request to change a previous decision, or part of that decision.

When

You have a right to make an appeal, but you must do so within 28 days after you have been notified of the decision.

Who

The NSW Civil and Administrative Tribunal (NCAT) will manage your appeal.

How
